Snow Removal and Ice Control Services for the Village Hall, Water Treatment Plant, and Conservancy

The Committee reviewed the revised proposals submitted by Discipio Enterprises and The Acres Group and snow removal cost comparisons for these services at the Village Hall, Water Treatment Plant and the Conservancy for the upcoming 2011-2012 snow season. The Acres Group reduced their unit price for salt. However, the overall proposal from Discipio Enterprises was lower than the overall proposal submitted by The Acres Group. A motion was made by Trustee Merci and seconded by Chairperson McCombie to accept the Discipio Enterprises snow removal proposal for the 2011-2012 snow season and recommend approval by the Village President and Board of Trustees at the October 13, 2011, Village Board meeting. Voice vote - all ayes. Motion carried.

Staff presented a copy of Dry Hydrant test results from the Barrington Countryside Fire District and a map outlining the locations of Dry Hydrants throughout the Village.
