Support March 2nd BCFPD Blood Drive

A community blood drive scheduled for Saturday, March 2nd, at the Barrington Countryside Fire Protection District's Lake Barrington headquarters, will be much more than a chance for residents to help restock area blood supplies: it will offer them an opportunity to partner with firefighters to deliver life-saving services.

The BCFPD blood drive, sponsored by Vitalant (*formerly LifeSource*) will take place in the Training Room at Fire Station #1 (22222 North Pepper Road), from 9 am – 3 pm. To schedule a donation, call 877-258-4825 or visit www.vitalant.org (use group code 763A).

Needs Rise While Donations Decline

Ensuring an adequate blood supply is among the most critical challenges facing U.S. hospitals, surgical centers, and emergency treatment facilities. Donations are on a decade-long decline, despite the growing need for blood and blood products. According to Vitalant, almost 7 million volunteers give blood on an annual basis – a 26% decline since 2010 – resulting in nearly 4.2 million fewer donations each year. Blood donation is a transformative act that can save lives. Each unit of donated blood can help up to three people. Join the BCFPD on March 2nd and help make a difference.

Blood Donation Preparation

Community members planning to give blood on March 2nd should prepare accordingly:

1. Eat a healthy, low-fat meal within two hours of your donation time. Eat a salty snack the day before your appointment to help maintain healthy blood pressure (your body loses salt during blood donation).
2. Stay hydrated by drinking 8 – 16 ounces of water one hour before you donate.
3. Avoid or limit caffeinated sodas, coffee, tea, or energy drinks on the day of your donation.

~~For~~ the April 2, 2019 election, registered voters in the Barrington 220 boundary area will have a chance to vote on a \$185 million school district referendum question. A successful referendum would help to:

- Protect the community's investment in Barrington 220 school buildings by repairing things like roofs, windows, plumbing, electrical systems, heating and air conditioning

PARK DISTRICT REFERENDUM

South Barrington Park District REFERENDUM Fact Sheet

Why does the Park District want to sell area “N”?

The park district would like to use proceeds to buy down existing debt, purchase other more strategically located property, improve existing parks with planned capital improvements.

Will selling this property increase my tax bill?

No. The property sale will not impact the park district tax bill.

What will happen to the property after sale?

Property would be subject to normal development requirements and would increase tax base.

How much park property does the district have now?

The Park District has 4 parks totaling 47 acres; Marvin Dunteman Park 5 acres, Community Park 20 acres, South Barrington Community Center 10 acres, and Area C (behind the Arboretum on Bridges Dr.) 12 acres.

Why does the sale have to go to referendum?

Park District rules require the sale question to be put to a referendum.

What will the question be on the ballot?
